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Introduction

The **Multi-Infuser™ System** is designed for controlled intermittent administration of intra-

venous medications. The system includes standard

disposable syringes, Microbore extension sets,

and the **Multi-Infuser™ 150XL** or **Multi-Infuser™ 300XL** syringe pump. These better controlled drug

devices provide ultimate control over both drug dosage and rate of administration. The **Multi-**

Infuser™ System provides reproducible, defined

safe, dependable and practical syringes of various sizes (5-60cc).

An issued or revised date for these instructions is included for the user's information. If a period

of two years has elapsed between this date and product use, the user should contact

Baxter Healthcare Corporation to learn if additional product information is available.



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Infusing Principles

The Micro-Infusor™ System may be used for intermittent infusions as follows:

- As an intermittent infusion system in combination with a gravity flow primary LV. The primary line flow rate is not interrupted but is operated continually to deliver microbubble fluids or drug diluents. The microbubble extension set should be attached to the primary line at an injection port or luer site.
- As a piggyback in combination with an LV.

4. As a piggyback in combination with a volume control chamber (burette). The flow rate for control is not interrupted; the Microbore extension set should be attached to the primary line either the lower injection port or the burette.

When using the Micro-Infusor™ System as a piggy-back into a running primary line, the syringe contents are further diluted by the primary solution. The equivalent dilution of the syringe volume into which the dose is effectively dissolved. This information is particularly important when delivering medications that require additional dilution.

The “total volume” calculated represents the total volume into which the dose is effectively delivered. This information is particularly important when calculating the dose to be administered.

$$\text{Total Volume (ml)} = (\text{Volume in Syringe} \times \text{Primary Rate (ml/hr)} + t)$$

Contents may be calculated as follows:

contents = $\frac{\text{Total Volume (ml)}}{\text{Primary Rate (ml/hr)}}$

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The Micro-Infusor™ System is a method of administration that will yield the desired delivery time. In many cases an isotonic solution is desired. The total dose will be infused accurately over the desired time period.

For intermittent administration, then dilute to the concentration that will yield the desired delivery time. Select the drug to be administered and dilute to the primary concentration that will yield the desired delivery time. The Micro-Infusor™ System is included as part of the syringe system and is used to sense the connection of the best sites.

Electronics to detect end of syringe and occlusion. Electronic circuitry is used to control the indicators, alarms and infusion modes, and to sense the connection of the best sites.

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Principles

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Note
drug infusion when starting the Mini-Hituser™ 150XL/300XL Pump. Primary flow is increased. The flashback slit or the lower "Y" slit should be used to minimize these effects.

10. To start the infusion, turn the Mini-Hituser™ 150XL or 300XL pump to the "On" position, turn the Mini-Hituser™ 150XL or 300XL pump to its upper end by fully depressing the Pusher. Fully squeeze the Release Lever until the Pusher is reset or released and the switch is cycled through the off position.

11. When infusion is complete, turn the Mini-Hituser™ 150XL or 300XL pump to the "Off" position. Fully squeeze the Release Lever. Reset the Pusher, and remove the syringe.

Note
When the flashing red light indicates the unit has occurred, the Mini-Hituser™ 150XL or 300XL pump will not restart until the pusher is reset or released and the switch is cycled through the off position.

The green light also indicates the active time of occlusion.

—Flashing red light indicates normal operation.

Warning
To reduce the risk of a bolus boling infused after an occlusion occurs, the pressure must be relieved prior to rearming the occlusion by pressing the flush button located on the side of the pump.

—Beeping audio alarm indicates the flushing function.

—Fushing yellow light indicates low battery.

When the yellow light occurs, the infusion may safely be continued to completion before replacing the batteries with "C" alkaline cells. There are typically 4 hours of battery life remaining.

Instructions for Use

B-D® Syringes
Accepted IV Therapy Principles and Techniques should always be followed for all intravenous admixtures.

1. Connect the infusion system together including filled syringe, tubing set, and delivery devices as required.

2. Purge the entire system of air and replace the distal cover.

3. Reset the Pusher of the Mini-Hituser™ 150XL or 300XL pump to its upper end by fully squeezing the Release Lever until the Pusher is free to move.

4. Snap the syringe barrel into the Syringe Holder Notch of the Holder.

5. Move the Pusher downward until it touches the syringe plunger, then release the lever.


6. For Model 300XL only, set the desired rate using the Rate Selector Switch located on the back.

7. Check the Time Scale and Infusing Mark to determine the infusion duration.

8. Secure the Mini-Hituser™ 150XL or 300XL pump in a convenient location using the optional Mounting Bracket or hang it from an IV pole using the Pole Loop.

9. Attach the primed tubing set to the appropriate infusion site, such as a hepatic lock or a primary administration set. When attached to a primary administration set, the flashback slit or the lower injection "Y" slit are the recommended sites.

10. When infusing into a "Y" site, the volume capacity of the primary set may cause either a delay of infusion or the primary set may cause either a delay of infusion into a "Y" site.

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- General**
- The Mini-Tituser™ 150XL and 300XL pumps are designed to provide many years of reliable service with only minor routine maintenance. A periodic annual check of the Mini-Tituser™ System should be made at least every six months. At this time it should be cleaned and disinfected if required, lubricated, and inspected as described below.
- Calibration**
- The Mini-Tituser™ 150XL and 300XL pumps are calibrated to ensure maximum life of the Mini-Tituser™ Holder Spinning.
- Lubrication**
- To ensure maximum life of the Mini-Tituser™ Holder Spinning.
- Release Movement (Check over time)**
1. Squeeze the Release Lever and check for free movement of Fuser.
2. Release and check for free movement.
3. Check condition and holding ability of Syringe Holder Spinning.
- Fusing (2-3Hz) Green light**
4. Turn switch to "On" and check for
- Reset**
5. Place the Fuser near the end of Syringe Holder and allow it to move the Syringe Holder so that the nozzle applies to the glass channel thereby squeezing a small amount onto the entire length of the nozzle applicator supplied with the grease.
6. Turn switch to "Off" then back to "On". Mini-Tituser™ System should not reset, but remain in attention mode.
- Alarm**
7. Reset Pusher with Release Lever and turn Mini-Tituser™ System mode to "On" with alarm should mimic the flashing red light.
- Reset**
8. Repeat 4 through 8 for each speed.
- Repetitive and Troubleshooting**
- Since specialized equipment is necessary to adjust the mechanics and electronics inside the Mini-Tituser™ 150XL and 300XL pumps, it is recommended to refer to the manufacturer for troubleshooting and repair.
- Should the Mini-Tituser™ 150XL or 300XL pump appear to be malfunctioning, check for the following:
- Proper battery orientation (i.e., negative end down, if battery life is less than specified during routine use when the batteries run down, it should be replaced immediately).
 - Proper switch location
